Sentence Stems A sentence stem is the beginning of a sentence. Think of the stem of a plant. It's not the whole plant, just the beginning of it. It helps students get their sentence started. Sometimes we use the term sentence starter interchangeably. Sentence stems give students the inertia to get their thoughts going. Then their sentences bloom.

Dr. Karin Hess combined Bloom’s taxonomy and Webb’s Depth of Knowledge into a single chart which she calls a Cognitive Rigor Matrix. (Hess, Carlock, Jones, and Walkup 2009) We have pulled out math examples from Hess’ Cognitive Rigor Matrix and placed them into three general categories, Understand,

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
